- 1. Alan Werner, P. E., Sr. NSPE Western Region Vice-President, called the meeting to order at 7:15 a.m. by welcoming all in attendance. There were self-introductions of all in attendance. - 3. MINUTES. The minutes of the September 28, 2002 meeting in Portland Oregon were approved as submitted.
- 4. Chairman's Report. VP Werner reported that the Western Region was held up as the example of how to organize the NSPE at the regional level. He has a two-page report.
- 5. Financial Report
 - a. The WR Annual Meeting in Portland showed a small profit returning \$431.48 to the Western Region in a report to Alan Werner, P. E. from William Breneman, P.E. of WSPE.
 - b. A current financial report of the WR was presented.
- 6. The revisions to the Operating Procedures of the Western Region were introduced. Two changes were recommended: (1) to add the words "and Pacific" to the name of the Region and (2) to exempt Guam from having to pay the fixed fee dues. The revised OP's had been posted on the WR website about the 1st of October 2002 for review and the notice of voting for approval was announced in the meeting Agenda. It was moved by Joe Rhodes and seconded by Ralph Dunham that the revisions to the OP's be approved conditionally based on an approval by the NSPE Board of Directors at their January 13, 2003 meeting and based on acceptance by Guam of the dues change. The Motion was approved.

Currently, Oregon is spending \$150/Mo. for three hours of their website Diva's time to maintain their website. Mike will create a proposal on cost sharing for this type of service. Sam reported on a history of the beginning of the Western Region as currently organized. The WR is the only region in NSPE that is thinking on a regional level. Then he presented a model of centralizing the administration of the Western Region. Will the member states buy into a centralized administration? Can we find sources of non-dues revenue and increase membership on a regional level? There was discussion on these issues.

Based on straw votes, there was not a consensus opinion on whether or not to organize the administrative services on a regional level. There needs to be more discussion on this and it needs to be done between now and the meeting in San Antonio. We need to discuss this and try to come to consensus then.
